# The American Legion Announces New Multiyear **Membership Option**

Legionnaires can now take advantage of a three-year membership starting with the 2025 membership year. Visit legion.org/renew for the multiyear membership of 2025, 2026 and 2027. Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:

- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the national American Legion website (legion.org/renew). Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.
- Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.
- There is not a discounted rate with the three-year membership.
- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.
- Those who sign up for a multiyear membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time they have signed up for the multiyear membership.

The multivear membership will work just like PUFL. Whatever rate the member renews at is what the post/department/national will receive for the duration of that timeframe. Once the member renews after the three-year renewal is up, the renewal rate will adjust to the rate at that time.

A multiyear membership was approved by the National Executive Committee of The American Legion during the organization's Spring Meetings last May.

# **Peanut Price Increase Announced**

After discussion during a recent membership meeting, it was unanimously agreed by those on hand it was time to announce a price increase to \$8/jar or \$90 for a case of 12 jars. This price will not take effect until July 1, 2024 to allow our vendors and partners time to adjust their pricing accordingly.

Inflationary costs, primarily from glass jars, has been driving down the post's profit margin to the point where this action was deemed necessary to sustain our community impact and existing programs. The model of offering a discount on case purchases was continued to encourage case sales from the post while attempting to shift jar sales to our partners at the two local Triangle ACE Hardware stores.

In addition, when we last raised prices there was concern we might experience a decrease in sales volume – when in reality sales continued to increase year over year. As such, those in attendance felt the market would readily absorb this increase and allow the post to climb closer to a reasonable margin of profit to sustain our community efforts financially into the future.

## How to Get Out the Vote but Remain Non-Political

This year ushers in a presidential election. And while American Legion posts are encouraged to promote "Get Out the Vote" (GOTV) efforts, it is important to remember to remain nonpartisan in the process.

The American Legion is a nonpolitical, nonpartisan organization but advocates for all U.S. citizens to register and vote in all elections. The American

Legion does not show preference for or against any particular candidate or political party.

With that mind, here are some dos and don'ts for Legionnaires and posts to follow during the election cycle.

- Can I wear my American Legion cap to a political event? No. The American Legion cap is
  considered the official legion uniform (see p. 38 of 2024 Officer's Guide). If attending a
  political event, The American Legion cap, or any clothing with The American Legion
  emblem visible, must be removed so as not to imply any endorsement by The American
  Legion.
- Can we use our American Legion post for a political event? When using post facilities to host any candidates, the post must remove American Legion emblems and American Legion flags to avoid any impression of endorsements. Candidates for all parties must be presented equal opportunity to use the facilities on the same terms and conditions as other competing candidates.
- Can I get The American Legion at the local, state and national level to support a candidate running for Congress or any political office? No. In Article II, Section 2, of the Constitution of The American Legion, "The American Legion shall be absolutely nonpolitical and shall not be used for the dissemination of partisan principles nor for the promotion of the candidacy of any person seeking public office or preferment." Additionally, the National Charter, approved by Congress, stipulates The American Legion as an organization is nonpolitical. Therefore, The American Legion as an organization is never to help or endorse a candidate. However, you, as a private citizen and not speaking for the organization, can do whatever is legal and ethical to advance his/her candidacy.
