RON & MARY HELEN MITCHELL LEGION BASEBALL SCHOLARSHIP

Lowe's Grove American Legion Post 416 has created a new \$250 Legion baseball scholarship in honor of Ron and Mary Helen Mitchell. Ron served in the U.S. Navy during the Korean Conflict, and both he and Mary Helen were both long-time members at Post 416. Ron transferred to Post Everlasting June 2023 at 86 years of age. The scholarship is chosen by our coaching staff and is awarded to a player that has a positive impact on his team, who shows up for every game and puts others ahead of himself. This year the awardee of this inaugural scholarship who best represents these qualities is Alex Pena. Congratulations!



GEORGE C. SCRUGGS LEGION BASEBALL SCHOLARSHIP

Post 416 has also created a new \$250 Legion baseball scholarship in honor of a co-founder of Legion baseball at the post, George C. Scruggs (photo on left). George served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War



and worked in multiple post officer roles over the years before transferring to Post Everlasting March 2025. To honor George, the team will wear "GCS" on their uniform sleeve this season. In addition, a scholarship chosen by our coaching staff will be awarded in his name to a player that best represents "citizenship through sportsmanship". The awardee of this inaugural scholarship is Gabriel Ferrell. Congrats!



A CENTURY OF 'CITIZENSHIP THROUGH SPORTSMANSHIP'

It was a big vision from a Big 10 commissioner. On July 17, 1925, the collegiate athletic executive spoke to The American Legion Department of South Dakota convention.

"There is nothing in our national life which stresses certain qualities that are expressed in our athletics," said John L. Griffith, a former World War I major and Legionnaire. "Intelligent courage, fighting instinct and cooperation are some things which I believe are visibly expressed in our athletic games ... American Legion posts, as a matter of citizenship training, could easily carry on such athletic activities throughout the United States."

Seven years removed from a war in which young Americans were not physically fit, Griffith understood the need for fitness to answer their nation's call if needed. After his address to the convention, state and then national resolutions were passed, and American Legion Baseball was born.

The program was a hit. By 1926, more than 52,000 players participated. Legends and war heroes such as Yogi Berra, Ted Williams and Bob Feller would comprise some of the 89 Hall of Famers who played American Legion Baseball over its first century.

By 1947, none other than New York Yankees great Babe Ruth would serve as a national spokesman and consultant for the program. The program grew substantially in the 1950s, to historic highs of team numbers and players.

In 2010, the American Legion National Executive Committee selected Shelby, N.C., as the home of The American Legion World Series, starting with 2011. Series coverage by ESPN soon expanded. Attendance records soon have been shattered almost annually since the single location was established.

Over its first century, more than 10 million young people have played American Legion Baseball. At various times, over half of Major League Baseball rosters were filled with former American Legion players. Many more were propelled into careers of service and success, thanks to lessons learned in this veteran-run program.
